Today is the Seventh Sunday after Easter, and Sunday after Ascension. This Sunday is also called "The World Communications Day – The right use of the Media"; a day to pray for the right use of media.

Even five years after its publication, the Encyclical "Laudato Si" is making its impact all over the world and, in the minds that had not been converted, the Corona Virus must have brought about a conversion. This encyclical was indeed a prophetic "wake up call" to action and conversion, a change that was mandatory at that point.

Next Sunday 31st of May is PENTECOST SUNDAY and is the end of the Easter Tide in the Liturgy.

I sincerely thank all of you who are giving their church contributions in spite of the lockdown situation we are in. God bless you all abundantly at this time and keep you all safe and sound, and let us continue to pray for our leaders that they may take the right decisions for the safety and welfare of the people at this time. Reflection Jesus Prayed to His Father "Eternal life means to know you, the only true God,, and to know Jesus Christ, whom you send" (Jn 17:3)

Today's Gospel is taken from Jesus' high priestly prayer. Also called Prayer of Consecration because Jesus consecrates Himself before his approaching death. Jesus begins His passion with a prayer. Our Lord meditates on what He has to do. He recommends His disciples to His Father. Now they must go out into the world and filled with Jesus' Spirit, teach all nations. The task of a Christian in the world is not an easy one. As the Lord prayed in the difficult hours of his life, we should do the same, especially as we prepare for Pentecost. Indeed, the lockdown time has to be turned into an Upper room experience, like the disciples being with Mary and in Prayer in the Upper Room, preparing to receive Holy Spirit.

Today's reading is a prayer, which appears at the conclusion of Jesus' Last Supper discourse. At the end of the prayer, Jesus is arrested in the garden. The prayer might be read as Jesus' final commendation of himself to the Father. In the prayer, Jesus also expresses care and concern for his disciples.



Jesus' prayer reaffirms the complete union between Jesus and the Father. Throughout John's Gospel, Jesus has been presented as the Word, who pre-existed with the Father and was sent to do the Father's work on earth. In this prayer we learn that Jesus' life and ministry have been directed toward one purpose, revealing the Father. When this work is accomplished, Jesus is to return to the Father to be glorified. Regardless of what happens to Jesus, in John's Gospel, Jesus and the Father are in charge. Even in the description of Jesus' death, Jesus does not simply die but instead hands over his spirit.

In today's Gospel we also note the distinction found in John's Gospel between the world and the disciples. The disciples are in the world, but they are separate from it because they have been given to Jesus. They are chosen from the world to be in service to the world for its salvation. This salvation has been accomplished in Jesus because Jesus has revealed the Father to the world, but the disciples will be sent by Jesus to make both the Father and Jesus known to the world. Jesus' prayer is for the disciples' work in the world.

Elisha's Fantastic Fundraising for the NHS

Elisha is an 11 year old altar server from Christ The King and, following a challenge from her cousins, Oliver and Jake, and being inspired by her step-sister who is a chaplain at a hospital in Basildon, Elisha has set about a fundraising campaign to raise £400 for NHS charities.

Elisha heard of the difficulties that hospitals and care workers are facing directly from her step-sister and felt moved to do something to help. "I wanted to do my part to help people risking their lives for us" said Elisha. The original challenge was to sing 14 songs in 14 days but Elisha increased that to 20 songs in 20 days! This means she is having to learn 15 new songs! That's quite some challenge!

Since she was three years old, Elisha has been singing and dancing and she began singing lessons at the age of 5. Thanks to modern technology she is able to continue to have her weekly singing and dancing lessons during lockdown via Zoom and on Day 10 of the challenge, encouraged by her singing teacher, she sang her first classical piece, Ave Maria, which can be found on the Parish Facebook page <https://www.facebook.com/ChristtheKingKinson/> as well as on her own page <https://www.facebook.com/Elisha-Entertains-105314500953204/>.

Some of Elisha's songs have been viewed over 4,000 times and donations are coming from places as far away as America and Australia. Half way through her challenge Elisha has raised over £700 so she has now revised her fundraising target to a staggering £1,500.

During lockdown Elisha spends about four hours a day doing schoolwork with the help of BBC Bitesize. But her routine starts with an early rise and rehearsal, then record the song of the day before there is too much noise from other people moving around, then start her school work and homework at around 9am. Elisha is finishing her time at St Walburga's this year and is looking forward to starting at St Peter's in September.

Celebrating Creation

Franciscan sister and scientist Ilia Delio writes that St Francis modelled a way of relating to creation with inherent dignity and equality rather than domination:

"[Francis] did not consider himself at the top of a hierarchy of being nor did he declare himself superior to the non-human creation. Rather, Francis saw himself as part of creation. His spirituality overturned the spirituality of hierarchical ascent and replaced it with a spirituality of descending solidarity between humanity and all of creation. . . . He found God in all creatures and identified with them as brother and sister . . . "because he knew they shared with him the same beginning." By surrendering himself and daring everything for love's sake, the earth became his home and all creatures his brothers and sisters. That led him to love and respect the world around him and made him truly a man of peace.

Only prayer, the Spirit of God breathing in us, dwelling in our hearts and joining us to Christ, can lead us, like Francis, to the contemplative vision of God's goodness in every creature and in every living thing. . . . The God within us is the God who permeates every aspect of our world—the One who is the source and goal of creation.
