THE LITURGY OF THE WORD**FIRST READING**

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

55:1-11

Oh, come to the water all you who are thirsty; though you have no money, come! Buy corn without money, and eat, and, at no cost, wine and milk. Why spend money on what is not bread, your wages on what fails to satisfy? Listen, listen to me, and you will have good things to eat and rich food to enjoy. Pay attention, come to me; listen, and your soul will live.

With you I will make an everlasting covenant out of the favours promised to David. See, I have made of you a witness to the peoples, a leader and a master of the nations. See, you will summon a nation you never knew, those unknown will come hurrying to you, for the sake of the Lord your God, of the Holy One of Israel who will glorify you.

Seek the Lord while he is still to be found, call to him while he is still near. Let the wicked man abandon his way, the evil man his thoughts. Let him turn back to the Lord who will take pity on him, to our God who is rich in forgiving; for my thoughts are not your thoughts, my ways are not your ways - it is the Lord who speaks. Yes, the heavens are as high above earth as my ways are above your ways, my thoughts above your thoughts.

Yes, as the rain and the snow come down from the heavens and do not return without watering the earth, making it yield and giving growth to provide seed for the sower and bread for the eating, so the word that goes from my mouth does not return to me empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do.

SECOND READING

A reading from the first letter of St John

5:1-9

Whoever believes that Jesus is the Christ has been begotten by God; and whoever loves the Father that begot him loves the child whom he begets. We can be sure that we love God's children if we love God himself and do what he has commanded us; this is what loving God is - keeping his commandments; and his commandments are not difficult, because anyone who has been begotten by God has already overcome the world; this is the victory over the world - our faith. Who can overcome the world?

Only the man who believes that Jesus is the Son of God: Jesus Christ who came by water and blood, not with water only, but with water and blood; with the Spirit as another witness - since the Spirit is the truth - so that there are three witnesses, the Spirit, the water and the blood, and all three of them agree. We accept the testimony of human witnesses, but God's testimony is much greater, and this is God's testimony, given as evidence for his Son.

GOSPEL REFLECTION



"The Spirit of the Lord fills the world", we read in the Book of Wisdom. Jesus, we hear today, is filled with the Holy Spirit who comes down on him "like a dove". In the Spirit, Jesus goes out into the wilderness; in the Spirit, in the power of the creating

Spirit, he goes around the Holy Land bringing new life, physical and spiritual, to those who will accept it. They have reason to accept his claims to spiritual authority - "Go in peace, your sins are forgiven" - for he demonstrates in himself the power of the Creator over the physical world. He walks on the water, creates bread from nothing, raises the dead. St. Peter, years later, in his second letter

to the churches, reminds the churches, "We had seen his majesty with our own eyes." Jesus' words as man are always effective; what he says will come about in the power of the Holy Spirit. Amazingly, the Baptist tells those listening to him:

Jesus will "baptise you with the Holy Spirit"! In other words, Jesus will give to those who follow him, his own intimacy with the Creating Spirit! In the Church's sacraments, in the Christian saints through the centuries, is clear evidence of the truth of that promise. The Word of God speaks through the Church and through the lives of those who are baptised.

11. Our own days, however, seem to be showing signs of a certain regression. Ancient conflicts thought long buried are breaking out anew, while instances of a myopic, extremist, resentful and aggressive nationalism are on the rise. In some countries, a concept of popular and national unity influenced by various ideologies is creating new forms of selfishness and a loss of the social sense under the guise of defending national interests. Once more we are being reminded that "each new generation must take up the struggles and attainments of past generations, while setting its sights even higher. This is the path. Goodness, together with love, justice and solidarity, are not achieved once and for all; they have to be realized each day. It is not possible to settle for what was achieved in the past and complacently enjoy it, as if we could somehow disregard the fact that many of our brothers and sisters still endure situations that cry out for our attention".

Christmas Thoughts from Michael Stead

'Epiphany', a Greek word, means to be lifted up (epi) because of being shown something in a new way (phainon).



At the Epiphany, science and religion come together. The three kings were astrologers - scientists of their day. The shepherds arrived on the instructions of an angel; but the kings examined the world, took measurements, consulted learned writings and acted on the outcome. 'We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him ... for this is what the prophet has written'. A thousand professors could wish that their students' methodology was as thorough.

The kings expected to find some great prince, born in a splendid palace, in a fine silken bed; but arrived in a stable and saw a lowly baby laid on some dirty straw. They learned something about the true nature of the world. They had an epiphany. As true men of science, they adapted: rather than report back to Herod as planned, 'they returned to their country by another route.'

Science and religion can be presented as implacable enemies: blind faith, or cold hard science. But they are simply two different ways that we can experience the world. Like sight and hearing, what sensible person would watch a song, or listen to a painting? Like the three kings, if we investigate the world, by faith or science, and find that it is not as we expected, we can continue as we were, or to react in a new way to what we discover. We have our own chance of an epiphany

Today, celebrating the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord, Christmas Season ends in our Liturgy and we enter the First Week of the Ordinary Time of the Liturgical Year.

Today's reading contains one of the Scripture's most dramatic references to the Trinity:

Father – (Voice coming from Heaven),....

Son – (Jesus coming out of water), ...

Spirit (Dove coming down on Jesus)

"As there are three musical notes but only one sound, likewise there are Three Persons, but only One God" (St. Ignatius)
