


GOSPEL REFLECTION



Jesus' relationship with the Father is well-documented in John's Gospel, as we have seen in our recent Sunday Gospels. Last Sunday, Jesus stood in the midst of his disciples and gave them the Holy Spirit. Today we have Jesus telling the Apostles to baptise "in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit". God

has revealed himself as an inseparable Trinity, something which causes plenty of problems for priests giving sermons on Trinity Sunday! Of course human reasoning will never be able to explain this divine reality, nor should it try to. The essence of God as three-in-one is that God is love. But love does not exist in a vacuum. Love has to have a subject and an object. If I love, I have to love someone, I can't just 'be' love. I must love my wife, or my husband, or my children or my parents etc. The Holy Trinity is a virtual circle of love. The Father loves the Son, the Son loves the Father, and the fruit of this love is the Holy Spirit. As Christians we are invited to imitate that form of love.

When we love each other with a pure love, wanting nothing for ourselves, then the Spirit of God is among us. In this way, God invites us, in some way, to participate in the life of the Trinity. It may seem crazy, but let's not forget that God also wants us to become him, by inviting us to eat his body and drink his blood. Our problem is that we have difficulty in really believing what Jesus has promised us.

BROTHERS AND SISTERS ALL GLOBALIZATION AND PROGRESS WITHOUT A SHARED ROADMAP

30. In today's world, the sense of belonging to a single human family is fading, and the dream of working together for justice and peace seems an outdated utopia. What reigns instead is a cool, comfortable and globalized indifference, born of deep disillusionment concealed behind a deceptive illusion: thinking that we are all-powerful, while failing to realize that we are all in the same boat. This illusion, unmindful of the great fraternal values, leads to "a sort of cynicism. For that is the temptation we face if we go down the road of disenchantment and disappointment... Isolation and withdrawal into one's own interests are never the way to restore hope and bring about renewal. Rather, it is closeness; it is the culture of encounter. Isolation, no; closeness, yes. Culture clash, no; culture of encounter, yes".

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Today, we celebrate TRINITY SUNDAY !

Feast of the Most Holy Trinity! Liturgically, we begin Nineth week in the Ordinary Time.

Pope Francis has the intention of the month of June to pray for young people who are preparing for marriage with the support of the Christian community.

On Monday May 31st, Holy Father will solemnly end the marathon chain Rosary in Vatican Gardens before the image of Our Lady, Untier of knots, which will serve as an open-air shrine for the occasion.

Let us join in crowing our Blessed Mother in our Grotto in St. Bernadette interceding her to untie the knots of our society especially in this pandemic situation, Unemployment, Violence in the families, human progress accessible to the weakest and the poorest, and praying for pastoral care that a new enthusiasm and impetus be experienced the Catholic communities.

Holy Trinity, the ineffable Mystery of God! The first thing our parents taught us about religion perhaps was most probably, the sign of the cross. The last thing a priest will do at our graveside is, to make the sign of the cross over our body. Yes, A Christian's life is marked with, "In the name of the Father, of Son and the Holy Spirit". Revelation of God as Father, Son and the Holy Spirit tells us first, what God is for men. But as to their mysterious unity, we can only stammer with inadequate human concepts which are not able to express the ineffable mystery of God in Himself. Man wants to know. But we must realize that more important than knowing about God, is KNOWING GOD, the way two beloved know one another! An intimate person to person relationship gives a knowledge which cannot possibly be expressed in human terminology. It is that kind of knowledge of God which ultimately satisfies a human being.
