Jesus said to the crowds: 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time: he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.



# Our Faith on Sunday

## GOSPEL REFLECTION



Since Our Lord's words come from the mouth of Wisdom Itself, we may legitimately look for manifold meanings. The Jerusalem Bible offers us a link between today's parable and the Book of Daniel, in the Old Testament. In that book, King

Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon has a dream. In it he sees a tree; *"It grew taller and stronger, until its top reached the sky...its foliage was beautiful; its fruit abundant...the birds of heaven nested in its branches."* This tree, Daniel explains, represents the king himself, *"For you have grown great and strong"*. But, Daniel continues, God is going to humble the overweening pride of the king, and the king succumbs to a long period of madness. How does this link up with our present parable? The 'mustard seed' can represent ourselves; we all begin life as *"the smallest of seeds"* and everything in us must develop. We grow, we *"put out branches"*, we make

lives for ourselves; perhaps, like Nebuchadnezzar, we become leaders, perhaps we are parents, responsible for others: like the great tree, *"giving shelter to all the birds of the air"*. God respects the gifts he has given us; but as the king learned, gifts must be acknowledged. God is an authority greater than nature whose *"ways are always just and He has power to humble those who walk in pride."*

## BROTHERS AND SISTERS ALL PANDEMICS AND OTHER CALAMITIES IN HISTORY

32. True, a worldwide tragedy like the Covid-19 pandemic momentarily revived the sense that we are a global community, all in the same boat, where one person's problems are the problems of all. Once more we realized that no one is saved alone; we can only be saved together. As I said in those days, "the storm has exposed our vulnerability and uncovered those false and superfluous certainties around which we constructed our daily schedules, our projects, our habits and priorities... Amid this storm, the façade of those stereotypes with which we camouflaged our egos, always worrying about appearances, has fallen away, revealing once more the ineluctable and blessed awareness that we are part of one another, that we are brothers and sisters of one another".

**CONFIRMATION** *the catechism of the Catholic Church says* 1285. Baptism, the Eucharist, and the sacrament of Confirmation together constitute the "sacraments of Christian initiation," whose unity must be safeguarded. It must be explained to the faithful that the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace. For "by the sacrament of Confirmation, [the baptized] are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed."

1302. It is evident from its celebration that the effect of the sacrament of Confirmation is the full outpouring of the Holy Spirit as once granted to the apostles on the day of Pentecost. 1303. From this fact, Confirmation brings an increase and deepening of baptismal grace:

- it roots us more deeply in the divine filiation which makes us cry, "Abba! Father!";
- it unites us more firmly to Christ;
- it increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us;
- it renders our bond with the Church more perfect;
- it gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross:
