Before the world was made, he chose us, chose us in Christ, to be holy and spotless, and to live through love in his presence, determining that we should become his adopted sons, through Jesus Christ for his own kind purposes, to make us praise the glory of his grace, his free gift to us in the Beloved in whom, through his blood, we gain our freedom, the forgiveness of our sins. Such is the richness of the grace which he has showered on us

in all wisdom and insight. He has let us know the mystery of his purpose, the hidden plan he so kindly made in Christ from the beginning to act upon when the times had run their course to the end: that he would bring everything together under Christ, as head, everything in the heavens and everything on earth]

And it is in him that we were claimed as God's own, chosen from the beginning, under the predetermined plan of the one who guides all things as he decides by his own will; chosen to be, for his greater glory, the people who would put their hopes in Christ before he came. Now you too, in him, have heard the message of the truth and the good news of your salvation, and have believed it: and you too have been stamped with the seal of the Holy Spirit of the Promise, the pledge of our inheritance which brings freedom for those whom God has taken for his own, to make his glory praised.

GOSPEL REFLECTION



The instructions given by Christ today, to his disciples, we see taken up by his saints. Saints give their 'all'; they hold nothing back. Our new English 'Venerable' (the stage before 'blessed'), Fr. Ignatius Spencer, the Passionist, is an

example. Fr. Ignatius was born the Honourable George Spencer, youngest son of the Second Earl Spencer. He had a comfortable and well educated youth. He became first an Anglican clergyman, but his love of truth gradually led him into the Catholic Church and he became a priest. Eventually, through his friendship with Blessed Dominic Barberi, he joined the Passionists. His years of priesthood are a story of constant and exhausting travelling – England, Ireland, Germany, Belgium – giving missions and retreats and begging for alms. A contemporary wrote of him, "His great charity to the poor and wandering beggars was unbounded.

At times he gave them all the money he had, and stripped himself of his clothes to give them to the distressed; and when he had nothing to give, he would thank God that he had only His holy truth to impart. His house was always open for the distressed." "How beautiful it would be," he was heard to say, "to die in a ditch, alone and unnoticed." And God fulfilled his longing and granted that prayer!

36. 'Let the righteous rejoice in the Lord, and take refuge in him! Let all the upright in heart give glory!' For now the Lord has risen, now he has ascended to heaven, now he has shown that here is another life, now it is evident that his counsels, in which he lay concealed in the depth of your heart, were not empty, for his Blood was shed to be the price of the redeemed. Now all things are made clear, all things have been proclaimed and believed. And under the whole of heaven ' Let the righteous rejoice in the Lord, and take refuge in him! 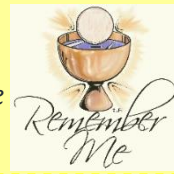
