GOSPEL REFLECTION



The disciples, it seems, like the scribes and Pharisees, but with more honesty, were expecting a Messiah who would eventually – and quite soon! – establish himself in power. They themselves would be in power with him – and who would be the greatest?! Consequently, Our Lord's

words about suffering and death, and even resurrection, went over their heads. And yet, how important those words have become! We know now, and they came to realize, that what happened to Christ did not happen by chance; it was all in the plan of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit for our salvation. Jesus as man knew and fully willed, all that should happen – for our sake! He did not look for power and glory, but to serve his Father's purpose: For all the more reason, then, did the disciples later understand, and have taught those who came after them, how important it is to obey the words of the "One Teacher"; to be as

he was, as children towards God their loving Father; seeking loving obedience, rather than human power and glory. Not purposeless obedience, for the One Teacher is also "The Way": the way to eternal life and happiness. Jesus said to them, *"In my Father's house there are many places to live in...I am going now to prepare a place for you...I shall return to take you to myself."*

46. 
