There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' Jesus said, 'Woman why turn to me? My hour has not come yet.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews; each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water,' and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now' he told them, 'and take it to the steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from — only the servants who had drawn the water knew — the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink; but you have kept the best wine till now.'

This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.

We are told of Mary, by St. Luke, that everything that happened to her, from the Annunciation on, she "kept in her heart"; not just in her mind, but in her loving and believing mind and in the living of her life. Word of God made man, he through whom the world was made. She believed that he came on earth to open the gates of happiness to the human race; not just final happiness in Heaven, but interior peace, happiness and contentment in this life. That was why she said, "Do whatever he tells you."




A STRANGER ON THE ROAD

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Dear Parishioners

Today, we are on the Second Sunday of the Ordinary Time. It is also called **PEACE SUNDAY**. We pray for peace between the nations, a lasting peace with justice. For all who work for peace that; that they may never forget the victims of war. For individuals groups and movements that promote war and conflicts, That Christ, Prince of Peace, might turn hearts to a culture of life.

Octave Prayer of Christian Unity falls in this week from 18th to 25th.

We pray for unity among the churches, a unity founded upon truth and compassion. For churches to find a common voice, to speak on matters that affect the whole of society.

Every week we will try to add a bit of reflection from Pope's Exhortation on Family Life. It is so wonderful for us as Parishioners of Holy Family Parish to reflect on "**Amoris Laetitia**" (**Joy of Love**) of Pope Francis on marriage and family and other issues of Family Life. It was a post synodal exhortation on Family, brought out in 2016. It was a call to delve deep into the spirituality of Family life. Trinity is present in the temple of marital communion. The spirituality of family life lies in this fact that the Lord dwells in real concrete families, with all their daily struggles and troubles, joys and hopes. *The spirituality of the family love is made up of thousands of small but real gestures.* Yes, marital spirituality is a spirituality of the bond, in which divine love dwells.

Reflection: "For the Lord delights in you" is the theme for today's readings. When in a marriage two people have grown into a mature love for one another, one of them can be heard to say in the course of a lively conversation "But my wife and I think..." Such partners have grown into the conjugal oneness mentioned in the Bible "The two of them become one body (Gn2:24, Mt.19:6). (Note the biblical language of "Body-Flesh" which stands for the whole person!). It can also happen that the marital oneness is overly stressed by one of the partners and might seek to mould his wife into a blueprint of himself where this love might turn into egotism.

Real love is participation into one another's personality with respect, never destroying it. In the awareness of the Bible, man is related to God in a sacred partnership (covenant) which has conjugal overtones. But in His great love God does not destroy us as persons. We are and should be different, though the same Spirit of Love has been given to us all. Christian should live in the joy of the wedding (partnership - covenant) between God and man. By performing His first miracle at the wedding feast at Cana, Jesus assumes the role of the groom by giving wine to the wedding guests. We are made to remember that in the Christian tradition, Christ is related to the Church, to all of us as a groom to his bride. (Eph.5:31-32).

In the meantime, May you all stay safe with Masks, Distancing and Cleansing!!!
