**'PALM' GOSPEL**

Luke 19:28-40

Jesus went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. When he drew near Bethphage and Bethany, at the Mount that is called Olivet, he sent two disciples, saying, 'Go into the village opposite, where on entering you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever yet sat; untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?" you shall say this, "The Lord has need of it."' So those who were sent went away and found it as he had told them. And as they were untying the colt, its owner said to them, 'Why are you untying the colt?' And they said, 'The Lord has need of it.' And they brought it to Jesus, and throwing their garments on the colt they set Jesus upon it. And as he rode along, they spread their garments on the road. As he was drawing near, at the descent of the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to rejoice and praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works they had seen, saying, 'Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!' And some of the Pharisees in the multitude said to him, 'Teacher, rebuke your disciples.' He answered, 'I tell you, if these were silent, the very stones would cry out.'

Today, is PALM SUNDAY.

We commemorate Our Lord's triumphal entry into Jerusalem before His passion and death. Prayerful meditation on Jesus' passion should make us grateful for what Jesus did for us. He has said " There is no greater love than this : to lay down one's life for one's friend. You are my friends" Jn15:13-14.

Christ entered in triumph into His own city to complete His work as our Messiah: to suffer , to die, and to rise again. Passion week highlights His strange ideas on suffering and death as a necessary passage to a better life. Hence suffering, death and resurrection belongs together. Jesus' death was not a defeat, it was a victory.

The genuine insight of Christianity is that these events in the life of Jesus were the execution of God's saving purpose. This insight should be ours too concerning our own lives when suffering strikes us.

The Church invites all its children to enter into this insight and spirit of this week by participating and meaningfully joining the celebrations of this week especially the Palm Sunday and the Pascal Triduum. Let today's prayer after communion be our prayer of the week, " Lord, the death of your Son gives us Hope, and strengthens our Faith. May His Resurrection give us perseverance and lead us to salvation. Amen".

**AMORIS LAETITIA:**

Here are 10 things to know about the Pope's ground-breaking new document on the Family.

6. What might work in one place may not work in another. The Pope is not only speaking in terms of individuals, but geographically as well. "Each country or region... can seek solutions better suited to its culture and sensitive to its traditions and local needs" (3). What makes sense pastorally in one country may even seem out of place in another. For this reason and others, as the Pope says at the beginning of the document, not every question can be settled by magisterium, that is, by the church's teaching office. (3)

through this Holy week.


As we do, may we remember that
