FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

13:14. 43-52

Paul and Barnabas carried on from Perga till they reached Antioch in Pisidia. Here they went to synagogue on the sabbath and took their seats.

When the meeting broke up, many Jews and devout converts joined Paul and Barnabas, and in their talks with them Paul and Barnabas urged them to remain faithful to the grace God had given them.

The next sabbath almost the whole town assembled to hear the word of God. When they saw the crowds, the Jews, prompted by jealousy, used blasphemies and contradicted everything Paul said. Then Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, 'We had to proclaim the word of God to you first, but since you have rejected it, since you do not think yourselves worthy of eternal life, we must turn to the pagans. For this is what the Lord commanded us to do when he said:

I have made you a light for the nations,
so that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth.'

It made the pagans very happy to hear this and they thanked the Lord for his message; all who were destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread through the whole countryside.

But the Jews worked upon some of the devout women of the upper classes and the leading men of the city and persuaded them to turn against Paul and Barnabas and expel them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in defiance and went off to Iconium; but the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.






This is a response to the suggestion that we come together for different forms of liturgy, with other churches and communities in the area.

Dear Parishioners,

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is known as **Vocations Sunday** or **Good Shepherd Sunday**, and is marked as the **World Day of Prayer for Vocations**.

The purpose of this day is to fulfil Jesus' instruction to "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send labourers into his harvest" (Matthew 9:38).

Our Holy Father Pope Francis says " Vocations are born in prayer and from prayer; and only through prayer can they persevere and bear fruit."

Dear brothers and sisters, let us pray earnestly for the vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, male and female religious life, secular institutes of charitable services, and to the missionary life.

Reflection: Jesus our good shepherd is knocking at the door of our heart.

On this fourth Sunday of Easter we celebrate the feast of Christ, our good shepherd who willingly laid down his life for his flock. We celebrate our shepherd because, he loves and cares for us in all circumstances. He is willing to lead all who follow and obey him to the spring of eternal life.
