

**GOSPEL REFLECTION**


Today's Gospel is one of the harsher warnings that Jesus gives his followers, or those who want to be his followers. A follower of Jesus has to be prepared to give up their human security and place all their trust in the Lord. Not all of us are called to follow Jesus in the way the Franciscans are, whose vocation is literally to have no fixed abode, but if we want to follow him, then we cannot base our life on human comforts and possessions.

It is a challenge to all of us to review the way we live and to see how much we are governed by our consumerist society.

And here Jesus also insists that our commitment to him should be total and immediate if we ask to become his followers.

The examples he gives of 'leaving the dead to bury their dead' and first saying 'goodbye to my people at home' are very demanding. Clearly, burying the dead is a duty and saying goodbye to people is a perfectly good thing to do, but in this context,

Jesus is warning us not to let the affairs of the world stop us from following him.

Today, is the Thirteenth Sunday of the Ordinary time.

It is a Parish Celebration Day as the first group our children this year are preparing to receive Jesus in their First Holy Communion. Congratulations to them and to their parents for leading them to a friendship with Jesus in this sublime Sacrament. Do continue to encourage them by your own example and support.

Bishop Mark now, having taken charge as the Archbishop of Cardiff, and the Bishop of Minevia, the present situation of our Diocese is truly *sede vacante*. Now we have a new Diocesan Administrator in the person of **Canon Paul Cummins**, who is entrusted with the responsibility of the day today running of the Diocese. We have a pastoral message to be read out in our parishes from our present Diocesan Administrator. Copy of which is available at the porch for those who would like to read.

**Last Sunday was a Day to Pray for Life!!!** It is a day set apart in the Church's year dedicated to raising awareness about the meaning and value of human life. To support this noble issue, we will have a **second collection** which we missed on last Sunday.

Today 26<sup>th</sup> of June, Family Year ends. World meeting of Families in Vatican on last Wednesday was a festival of families in the presence of Holy Father. The couple Gregory and Lisa of Domestic Church Life spoke of the Liturgy of Domestic Church Life, describing "it as a model of family spirituality. It's all about bringing little bit of God into everything we do in the family. It is also about making sure that we bring God into everything we do together in the little ways that we live our family life, rather than isolating that time with God to a specific family prayer time which often we get missed in the "sloppiness" of a busy family life".

**Reflection: "I am the Living Bread that comes down from Heaven....." "Anyone who.....keeps looking back is of no use for the kingdom of Heaven" (Lk. 9:62)**

Bela Karolyi was a gymnastic coach for Romania in the days of Communism and Iron Curtain. He developed such Olympic stars as gold medallist Nadia Comaneci. His international fame won him special government favours, including such things as a Mercedes – unheard of in Communist countries at that time. Then in 1981 he decided to turn his back on Communism and seek a free life in the west. When the "Zero hour" for leaving came, Bela did not look back at his state favours, his Mercedes and his celebrity status. He simply walked straight ahead, carrying only a small suitcase. Bela Karolyi is a perfect image of the kind of follower Jesus had in mind. How closely do I mirror that image? Our children who receive Jesus for the First time in this Sacrament, need our support through prayers, and sacrifices that they will not look back from the steps they are taking today. Let nothing deter them in their determination of loving Jesus and following Him all through their life.
