The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out  
ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself  
was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the  
labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send  
labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am  
sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no  
haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever

will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said 'even





**GOSPEL REFLECTION**

In this Gospel, Jesus gives very precise instructions to his closest followers about how  
to conduct themselves when trying to spread the Good News.  
Like last Sunday's Gospel, Jesus does not beat about the bush. He calls for a very  
radical approach and warns them what to do when they are not made welcome.

Most Christians today do not travel from town to town to  
evangelise the people there but what Jesus says in this Gospel  
can also be applied to them. Attending Sunday mass in our lo-  
cal parish however, is not what following Jesus is about.  
Pope Francis speaks frequently about the Church being  
missionary and engaging with the poor, the marginalised and  
the oppressed.  
Celebrating the Eucharist together every week with our fellow  
Catholics is how we gain the strength and the grace to go out  
to our many brothers and sisters who are in need. But this is  
not social work, it is taking Christ out into the community,  
yes , to provide for their physical needs, but through that to  
share the love of God with them.

Today, is the Fourteenth Sunday of the Ordinary time.

It is a Parish Celebration Day as the Second group our children this year are preparing to receive Jesus in their First Holy Communion. **Reflection:** *Jesus sent His disciples to preach the Good News to all, telling them "Whenever you go into a house, first say, "Peace be with this house" Lk. 10:5*

Helen Keller could neither see nor hear. Yet she became a great public speaker. One night after a lecture, someone asked her this question: "If you could have one wish granted, what would it be? The questioner thought Helen might say, " I would wish to have the ability to see and hear". But she said, "I would wish for the world peace.". Jesus would have applauded Helen Keller's beautiful response. For that is what He told His followers to be, " instruments of peace. "Happy are those who work for peace" Jesus told the crowds on the mountain. "God will call them His children".

Our children who have come forward today to receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, for the First time, are called to be instruments in the hands of Jesus for peace, peace in their schools, peace at home, and for peace wherever they go later in life. Today we pray for our children as they make this pact with Jesus, and


