

**GOSPEL REFLECTION**



In Lister Park, Bradford, there is  
statue of Samuel Lister. Lister  
was an inventor and mill owner  
who made a fortune from the  
textile industry. His motto was  
"Tha is what tha 'as" (You are

what you have). It is a motto  
which many of today's  
billionaires appear to live by, but  
one which many ordinary folk,  
in dreaming of becoming  
wealthy, believe in, without  
knowing it. In the Gospel about  
Mary and Martha we see the  
importance of being rather than  
doing. Here we see the  
importance of 'being' rather  
than 'having'. In this Gospel  
Jesus says: 'a man's life is not  
made secure by what he owns,  
even if he has more than he  
needs.' And what are our needs?  
If we look seriously at our  
material needs, we will see that  
many of the things we own are

not really 'needs' at all. If we  
look at the increasing number  
genuinely needy people in our  
own society today, those on low  
incomes who have to make a  
choice between 'eating' and  
'heating', we may well feel  
compelled to review our own  
expenditure on items that are  
more 'wants' than 'needs'. If we  
do this, we will make ourselves  
'rich in the sight of God.'

**Clergy Safeguarding Conference 2022** : On Thursday 14th June we held our first in-person Clergy Safeguarding Conference since 2019 at Exeter Racecourse. We had 70 priests and deacons from across the diocese in attendance, including some who had travelled from other countries. The aim was to build on training that has taken place previously, with an emphasis on our clergy having self-awareness of their own wellbeing. We both had the chance to attend the conference, which was enriching, and a happy meeting with the brother priests and deacons of our diocese after so long.

**Pope Francis in Canada:** Pope Francis is visiting Canada from July 24 to 29, 2022, specifically the provinces of Alberta, Quebec, and Nunavut. It is the first papal visit to Canada since 2002, when Pope John Paul II visited the country. His six-day tour included a formal apology for the Catholic church's role in the country's residential school system, through which more than 150,000 Indigenous children were forcibly removed from their homes to be assimilated in Christian schools. "I humbly beg forgiveness for the evil committed by so many Christians against the Indigenous peoples," Pope Francis said.

**Visit of the Relics of St. Bernadette:** Relics of St. Bernadette is touring all over UK. Relics are taken solemnly to every Cathedral of the Diocese. It arrives in our Cathedral in Plymouth on 9<sup>th</sup> and departs on 10<sup>th</sup> of September. Our Church in Ensbury Park is dedicated to St. Bernadette, and IT IS THE FIRST in the whole CATHOLIC CHURCH to be dedicated to St. Bernadette. Our parish could think of a representation in Plymouth during this event in Plymouth Cathedral.

### Update on Glenn Carroll's Diaconate Formation

Well, God willing, I will be embarking on Year 3 in September. My 2nd year has been an eye opener as the assignments became more in depth and I have truly sensed the continuation of a real positive change in my spiritual self.

Every month, we continue the journey to St Marys Seminary College, Oscott, Birmingham which is becoming easier and I am sure that the car knows its own way now and the friendships we have made are there for a lifetime.

I thank all of you who pray for me and my family and give thanks to Father Chacko and Babu for their continued support and guidance which plays a part alongside my regular spiritual direction and reconciliation.

It is a tough time being a Christian along with everything else which has been thrown at us over the last 2 years but if we stay strong & true; Together we are church, together we are community and together we are Christ.

May I humbly ask for your continued prayers as I start Year 3 (of 4) and with God's grace, to ordination in 2024.

The word *deacon* derives from the Greek *diakonia*, meaning "service," indicating that a deacon is called like Christ to be a servant. The Order of Deacon has three essential functions: the proclamation of the Gospel, the service of the liturgy, and the administration of charitable works. In particular, the deacon may assist the bishop and the priests in a variety of liturgical functions: Deacons may baptise, witness the exchange of vows and bless marriages, distribute Holy Communion, impart benediction with the Blessed Sacrament, bring Viaticum to the dying, read Sacred Scripture to the faithful and especially proclaim the Gospel, preach, officiate at funerals and burials, and administer the sacraments.

(Confer the *Catechism*, No. 1569-70, and the *Dogmatic Constitution on the Church*, No 29).
