

ST FRANCIS OF ASSISI-4TH October



Francis was the son of a wealthy cloth merchant and had a rich easy life and was able to live a life doing exactly what he pleased. Francis wanted to be a brave heroic knight so went to war in the 4th Crusade. On his way, God came to him in a dream and told him to go home which he did. He was ridiculed on his return and his father was angry with him for 'running away' from the battle.

Francis began to pray asking God what he wanted from him—his answer was 'build my church!'. Francis thought he meant the derelict church in a near town which he did and sold some of his fathers cloths to buy items. His father found out and took Francis to the bishop telling him to get Francis to denounce his inheritance and pay back the money from the cloth he had stolen. Francis returned the money to his father plus the clothes he was wearing stripping his vestments right there and stating that from this moment, God was his father and He would provide for him. Fran-

cis then lived a very simple life embracing the poverty. He preached about the simple life, making poverty holy. He had a great love of all creation seeing God in all things. Many started to follow him and his simple ways and became friars. When the bishop showed horror at the friars' hard life, Francis said, "If we had any possessions we should need weapons and laws to defend them." Possessing something was the death of love for Francis. Also, Francis reasoned, what could you do to a man who owns nothing? You can't starve a fasting man, you can't steal from someone who has no money, you can't ruin someone who hates prestige. They were truly free. He died at 45 years old.
