FIRST READING

A reading from the book of Exodus

32:7-11. 13-14

The Lord spoke to Moses, 'Go down now, because your people whom you brought out of Egypt have apostasised. They have been quick to leave the way I marked out for them; they have made themselves a calf of molten metal and have worshipped it and offered it sacrifice. "Here is your God, Israel," they have cried "who brought you up from the land of Egypt!" I can see how headstrong these people are! The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. 'This man' they said 'welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he spoke this parable to them:

'What man among you with a hundred sheep, losing one, would not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the missing one till he found it? And when he found it, would he not joyfully take it on his shoulders and then, when he got home, call together his friends, and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," he would say "I have found my sheep that was lost." In the same way, I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine virtuous men who have no need of repentance.

'Or again, what woman with ten drachmas would not, if she lost one, light a lamp and sweep out the house and search thoroughly till she found it? And then, when she had found it, call together her friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," she would say "I have found the drachma I lost." In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing among the angels of God over one repentant sinner.'





**FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE CROSS**

On 13 September 335, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher (also called the Church of the Resurrection) was dedicated. The following day, the cross that Empress Helena had discovered on 14 September 320, was venerated in a solemn ceremony. In 614, the Persian King, Chosroes II, waged war on the Romans. After conquering Jerusalem, he confiscated many treasures, among which was the Cross of Jesus. The Byzantine emperor Heraclius initiated peace negotiations, but was rejected. He then waged war and won near Nineveh, asking for the restitution of the Cross, which then returned to Jerusalem. Today, the cruelty of the Cross is not what is exalted, but the Love that God manifested to humanity by accepting death on the Cross: "Who, though in the form of God, emptied himself, taking the form of a slave. This is the glory of the Cross of Jesus!" (Pope Francis)

Dear Parishioners, Today is twenty fourth Sunday of the ordinary time.
May we continue to pray for our Diocese, looking for a new Bishop, and our usual prayer for peace in Ukraine.

Reflection: *“Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loose one.....
.carries back home...”(Lk. 15:4-5)*

The parable of the Good Shepherd reveals three amazing things about God’s love for us. First, God’s love is **Personal**. God doesn’t love us globally, but individually, each of us in special and personal way.

Second, God’s love is **Unconditional**. God doesn’t love us only on condition that we stay good and do not stray into sin. God loves us even when we stray , and to the point of going in search of us.

Finally, God’s love is a **Rejoicing Love**. God’s response upon finding us is total joy – with no admixture of rebuke.

What dimension of God’s love do I personally think is most amazing ?

Our nation has had a week of news.....a new Prime Minister and then sadly, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II who died on Thursday.

She was a person marked by a strong sense of duty and commitment to God and to her people. The long reign has ended at a time, when the leadership and the government has fallen into fresh hands that will steer the destiny of this Nation perhaps through stormy waters.
