
PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION



ST VINCENT DE PAUL—27TH SEPT

Vincent was born in Landes, 24 April 1581 and ordained priest at Chateau-l'Eveque 23 Sept 1600. At first, he worked in Paris in parish ministry and later accepted the position of chaplain in the household of the Gondi family. He devoted himself entirely to the alleviation of the lot of the poor, and to that purpose he established the Congregation of the Mission, which he also entrusted with the formation of a saintly clergy. With the co-operation of Louise De Marillac,

he founded the company of the Daughters of charity too. He died in Paris 27 September 1660 and was beautified August 1729 and canonised June 1737.

Pope Leo XIII appointed him Patron Saint of all the works of charity in the world which originated from him.

Today the St Vincent de Paul Society (SVP) has 10,000 members working to tackle poverty by providing assistance and friendship to people in need.
