


**ST JOHN PAUL II POPE 22 OCTOBER**

Karol Joseph Wojtyla was born in 1920 in Wadowice, Poland. By the time he
was 21, he had lost his mother, father and older brother. When war broke, he
enrolled in an underground seminary in Krakow and ordained in 1946.
He continued to study and earned a doctorate in Philosophy and in Theology.
In 1958 he was appointed Bishop and became Archbishop of Krakow in
1964. He took part in the Second Vatican Council. During this time, he led a
new investigation into the works of Faustina Kowalska and her works. He
shared the same hometown with her. In April 1978, after decades of work
and now a cardinal, the Vatican reversed its ban on her works and the Divine
Mercy devotion.

On 16 October 1978, he was elected pope and took the name John Paul II.
In 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized Saint Faustina Kowalska, 'the great
Apostle of Divine Mercy' and dedicated the first Sunday after Easter as Mercy
Sunday.

In 27 years of his papal ministry, St John Paul II wrote 14 encyclicals and 5 books, he canonised 482 Saints
and beatified 1,338 people. He promoted ecumenical and interfaith initiatives and made pastoral visits to 124
countries being outspoken on wars and the death penalty. In his last few years, he suffered with health problems
and on 2 April 2005, the eve of The Divine Mercy Sunday, he departed peacefully in the Lord.

Reflection: “You shall be my witnesses”(Acts 1:8)

Pope Francis’s message for the World Mission Sunday is a reflection of this year’s theme “You shall be My Witnesses”. The Holy Father recalls that the Church is Missionary by nature and that we are called at Baptism to share in this mission together when he said, “Every Christian is called to be a missionary and witness to Christ. And the Church, the community of Christ’s disciples, has no other mission than that of bringing the Gospel to the entire world by bearing witness to Christ.” To evangelize is the very identity of the Church, relating one with God and the best means to it is in prayer.

Jesus speaks of Prayer in today’s gospel. There is no doubt that “how to pray” is a problem for many a Christian. To begin with, one must get rid of the secret suspicion that the prayer is nothing else but a good psychological means of comfort by talking persuasively to oneself, as it is for the man who cannot see God transcending creation as an Absolute You. Following our faith in Jesus, we know that the ground of our being, the Ultimate Reality, God, is a “You”, really related to us as a person. Hence prayer is that encounter, the meeting between you and God. Prayer is a dialogue between you and the “Absolute You”.
