Luke 21:5-19

The Lord be with you. **And with your spirit.** A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now – the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?'

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not so soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.

'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name – and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.



*Dear Parishioners,* Today is Thirty third Sunday of the ordinary time.

We are in the month of November, a month specially dedicated to the holy Souls in Purgatory. Our daily masses will be for the holy souls in purgatory, and I encourage the parishioners to join a week day mass here in the parish for our dear departed. We had two burials in our parish this week. May their souls rest in peace !!!

Today the Church celebrates "The World Day of the Poor" and pray for the Poor in this world. We pray for the Church of God that it may reflect on how poverty is at the very heart of the Gospel and for all who work with the poorest in our society, encouraged by the God of mercy, may they bring hope and dignity to all in need. Our parish would like to welcome the needy and poor and make our church hall open and welcome anyone who needs a warm place especially during this coming winter.

Today is also REMEMBRANCE DAY also known as POPPY DAY and is considered a Memorial Day in Commonwealth member states for the First world war victims following a tradition inaugurated by King George V in 1919. The Day is also a Day for war remembrances in non-commonwealth countries as well. We will remember and pray for all war heroes and victims of war and violence.

Fr. Babu will be leaving us on 16<sup>th</sup> of November to take charge as assistant Parish Priest in Dorchester to help Fr. Barry Hallett. This Sunday will be his last mass as an assistant here. I know you will all join me in wishing him well and to thank him for all that he has done in our parish. He will be greatly missed but hope to have him back with us before too long. There will be cakes in the parish lounge after 9.30 mass on 13<sup>th</sup> Sunday to give parishioners a chance to see him before he goes.

As Fr. Babu leaves the parish for the time being, we will drop the weekday mass on Wednesday in St. Bernadette, which was introduced at his arrival.

**Reflection:** *Jesus shocked His disciples saying*

***"The time will come when not a single stone here will be left in its place. Everyone will be thrown down" (Lk 21:6)***

The movie *"It happened tomorrow"* opens with a businessman wishing he could buy tomorrow's paper today. Then an old man appears, with tomorrow's paper, saying, "I have decided to grant your wish". The rest of the movie deals with what happens with the businessman because of his "future" knowledge. Jesus does this in today's reading. He lets His disciples glimpse the future. The Church uses this reading on this next-to-the-last Sunday of the liturgical year to invite us to reflect upon the end of the world – or the end of our life, whatever comes first. How prepared am I for that end ?

"Day of the Lord" often called "The Day" or "That Day" is a concept often found in the Bible. It is the Day the God will intervene in favour of the righteous. And punish the wicked. In the New Testament, "That Day" relates to second coming of the Lord Jesus to judge the living and the dead. When the "Day of the Lord" is mentioned a warning of alert goes with it.

Yes, the Lord could come at a moment we least expect!
