**FIRST READING**

A reading from the second book of Maccabees 7:1-2. 9-14

There were seven brothers who were arrested with their mother. The king tried to force them to taste pig's flesh, which the Law forbids, by torturing them with whips and scourges. One of them, acting as spokesman for the others, said, 'What are you trying to find out from us? We are prepared to die rather than break the Law of our ancestors.'

With his last breath the second brother exclaimed, 'Inhuman fiend, you may discharge us from this present life, but the King of the world will raise us up, since it is for his laws that we die, to live again for ever.'

After him, they amused themselves with the third, who on being asked for his tongue promptly thrust it out and boldly held out his hands, with these honourable words, 'It was heaven that gave me these limbs; for the sake of his laws I disdain them; from him I hope to receive them again.' The king and his attendants were astounded at the young man's courage and his utter indifference to suffering.

When this one was dead they subjected the fourth to the same savage torture. When he neared his end he cried, 'Ours is the better choice, to meet death at men's hands, yet relying on God's promise that we shall be raised up by him; whereas for you there can be no resurrection, no new life.'

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

Some Sadducees – those who say that there is no resurrection – approached Jesus and they put this question to him, 'Master, we have it from Moses in writing, that if a man's married brother dies childless, the man must marry the widow to raise up children for his brother. Well, then, there were seven brothers. The first, having married a wife, died childless. The second and then the third married the widow. And the same with all seven, they died leaving no children. Finally the woman herself died. Now, at the resurrection, to which of them will she be wife since she had been married to all seven?'

Jesus replied, 'The children of this world take wives and husbands, but those who are judged worthy of a place in the other world and in the resurrection from the dead do not marry because they can no longer die, for they are the same as the angels, and being children of the resurrection they are sons of God. And Moses himself implies that the dead rise again, in the passage about the bush where he calls the Lord the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob. Now he is God, not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all men are in fact alive.'





**GOSPEL REFLECTION**



Today's Gospel recounts one of the many occasions when Jesus was challenged by the Jewish leaders. This time it is the Sadducees who try to trick him. The Sadducees were

religious Jews who were high priests and nobles. They were wealthy, influential, and powerful. They did not believe in the resurrection, which is probably why they asked this particular question. Knowing this, Jesus tells them that "Moses himself implies that the dead rise again". Jesus makes it very clear to the Sadducees that after the resurrection life will be completely different to that on earth and that there will be

no 'marriages' there. We have to be careful, because the desire of many married couple is that they will be reunited in the next life. It is true that we will be reunited to our loved ones in heaven, but our relationships will be on a totally different level. We will be related to all the 'residents' in heaven, but in God.

*Dear Parishioners,* Today is Thirty Second Sunday of the ordinary time.

We are in the month of November, a month specially dedicated to the holy Souls in Purgatory. The Church offers the Eucharistic sacrifices and its own intercession for the dead not only at their funerals and anniversaries but also in the yearly remembrance of all the sons and daughters of the church who sleep in Christ. The Church seeks to help the faithful departed by earnest prayer to God for their entry into communion of the saints in heaven. They are the most vulnerable ones who need our prayers and sacrifices since they cannot do any spiritual help for their own entry into heaven. Our daily mass will be for the holy souls in purgatory, and may I request you, as your time permits, to join our daily mass celebrated in the parish and pray for our dear departed.

**Fr Babu will be leaving us on 16th November to take up a position in Dorchester to help Fr Barry Hallett.**

**I know you will all join me in wishing him well and to thank him for all that he has done in our parish. He will be greatly missed but we hope to have him back with us before too long. There will be cakes in the parish lounge after the 9.30 Mass on Sunday 13th to give parishioners a chance to see him before he goes.**

**Reflection:** Asked about after life, *Jesus told "Moses clearly proves that the dead are raised....He speaks of the Lord as.....God of the living"*(Lk 20:17-20)

A little girl bounced excitedly up the airport ramp to board a plane. "Where are you going" her mother asked. Without missing a bounce she replied "To Granny's, to Granny's, to Granny's!". The girl's answer helps to illustrate Jesus' point about the afterlife. We should think of it not so much as being in a **Place** as being with a **Person**.

Yes, how tenacious is that inborn instinct in all of us to go on living even after this life comes to an end. Great leaders found memorials and write memoirs. We do not want to fade into oblivion. How do we survive? In the memory of my beloved ones, I will live on as the person they have known. In God, I will live on as the person I am. We know great men and women who live in our memories. These people were great not so much for what they accomplished as for what they were in themselves. That is why there are millions of housewives who did not accomplish spectacular things but are great because they were faithful to themselves and to their call in life. They live on as beautiful persons. Mary the Mother of Jesus, is certainly one of them.
