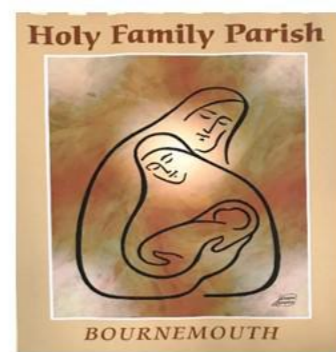

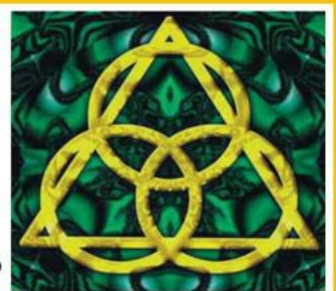

GOSPEL REFLECTION



Today's Gospel speaks of the Father and the Son but, strangely, on the Feast of the Holy Trinity, there is no mention of the Spirit.

However, it is clear from last week's Gospel that the Holy Spirit has a crucial role to play in the life of believers. What is also clear, especially in John's Gospel, is that there is an unbreakable bond of love between the Father and the Son. The fruit of this bond of love is the Holy Spirit. Jesus tells us that the way to the Father is through the Son, that is through him. We can know and love the Father through loving his son. And the most immediate way of loving Jesus is by loving our brothers and sisters, whoever they may be, members of my family, work colleagues, the beggar on the street. Unless I love especially the least of these fellow human beings, the Father does not recognise me. And where does the third member of the Holy Trinity come into all of this? In loving the Father, through the Son, I receive the precious gift of the Spirit. The Holy Spirit then strengthens me to be able to love my brothers and sisters even more. If we enter into this relationship with the Father though the Son and thus receive the gift of the Spirit, then, in a certain way we also participate in the life of the Trinity, which is no less than a cycle of perfect love.
