FIRST READING Wisdom 6:12-16

Wisdom is bright, and does not grow dim. By those who love her she is readily seen, and found by those who look for her. Quick to anticipate those who desire her, she makes herself known to them. Watch for her early and you will have no trouble; you will find her sitting at your gates. Even to think about her is understanding fully grown; be on the alert for her and anxiety will quickly leave you. GOSPEL A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 25: 1-13

Jesus told this parable to his disciples: "The kingdom of heaven ill be like this: 10 bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and 5 were sensible; the foolish ones did take their lamps, but brought no oil, whereas the sensible ones took flasks of oil as well as their lamps. The bridegroom was late and they all grew drowsy and fell asleep. But at midnight there was a cry, "The bridegroom is here! Go out and meet him." At this, all those bridesmaids woke up and trimmed their lamps and the foolish ones said to the sensible ones, "Give us some of your oil: our lamps are going out." But they replied "There may not be enough for us and for you; you had better go to those who sell it and buy some for yourselves." They had gone off to buy it when the bridegroom arrived. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding hall and the door was closed. The other bridesmaids arrived later. "Lord, Lord," they said "Open the door for us." But he replied, "I tell you solemnly, I do not know you." So stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour".

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Thirty Second Sunday in the Ordinary time.!

In light of the ongoing conflict in The Holy Land, The Catholic Bishops Conference of England and Wales has released a statement from Bishop Declan Lang, Chair of the Bishops' Conference's International Affairs department, and Bishop Nicholas Hudson, Chair of the Holy Land Co-ordination have released a statement on the ongoing Israel/Hamas war:

"To our brothers and sisters across the Holy Land, particularly those sheltering in the Parish of the Holy Family in Gaza along with those in the West Bank, we remain close to you and in constant prayer for you at this most difficult, terrifying, and testing of times. May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you always.

"To our own government, we urge you to continue your diplomatic efforts for a ceasefire, the immediate release of all hostages and the facilitation of humanitarian aid so that desperately needed food, water, fuel, and medical supplies can be safely delivered into Gaza. We will continue to add our voice to the impassioned chorus calling for justice, peace, and the cessation of the suffering that has descended upon the Holy Land.

"To the Catholic Community here in England and Wales, please join us in prayer for those in the Holy Land, particularly for those who have been taken hostage, those who have been killed, those who have been injured, and their families.

"We also pray for those who are wearied by the conflict to receive strength, and those in positions of power and authority receive the wisdom to quide them into ways of peace and justice."

For Faithful people Life is changed, not ended. This Month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. We have in place the Book of Remembrance in both the churches. May I request you to write the names of those near and dear ones who have died, and the date you would like them to be remembered. Do make it a point to attend a mass, if you can, on the date you have chosen.

Reflection: "Watchout then, because you do not know the day or the hour of the Son of Man's coming" (Mt.25:13)

Swiss Psychiatrist Dr. Paul Tournier dates his conversion to a day when he chose to spend an hour praying. It proved to be a dry, painful experience. But when the hour was over, something inspired him to pray a bit longer. He did and ended up experiencing God's presence in a way that changed his life. It frightened him to think how close he had come to missing it.
