GOSPEL A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 25:31-46

Jesus said to his disciples: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate the men from one another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right hand "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me a drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you a drink? When did you see you a stranger and made you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or imprison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me". Next he will say to those on his left hand "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food, I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked , sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer "I tell you solemnly in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment and the virtuous to eternal life."



GOSPEL REFLECTION

In serving others, we serve Jesus.
The haggard, the helpless, the hurting, the wanton, the weary, the wasted, those in prisons, those in palaces, those in pain, the sinner lost and the sinner saved - whomever God orchestrates to be in our spheres, we are to serve as the need presents itself - just as we would serve our Saviour if it were He in our presence. It is faith manifesting itself in love.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that "charity is the soul of the holiness to which all are called: it 'governs, shapes and perfects all the means of sanctification.'"

And quoting St. Therese of Lisieux, it reminds us: If the Church was a body composed of different members, it couldn't lack the noblest of all; it must have a heart, and a heart burning with love. And I realized that this love alone was the true motive force which enabled the other members of the Church to act; if it ceased to function, the apostles would forget to preach the Gospel, the martyrs would refuse to shed their blood.

Love, in fact, is the vocation which includes all others; it's a universe of its own, comprising all time and space -it's eternal! (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 826).

Lord, Help me make a real effort to make your charity a reality in my life. Make my holiness real. Let it be characterized by a heartfelt, growing and universal love for all people. Let my heart beat in unison with yours. Open my eyes to all the good that I can do for my brothers and sisters, and don't allow me to walk away from any opportunity to show this world your love. Amen.
