# **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

Advent begins today, we spend this time preparing for the coming of Christ into our world. He is here already, of course but he wants to come closer.

Advent is a time for hope. The placing of this Gospel at the beginning of Advent challenges listeners to be ready: although we might know the date of Christmas, the day on which God comes into our lives – in a myriad of forms – is not known: we must be ready and 'keep awake' so as not to miss it.

The Gospel challenges us to see the world differently, to 'be awake' to what is happening around us, to the challenges of the world; to building the kingdom of God. This alertness calls us to confront injustice in every form and not to hesitate. Being awake means being ready for action. It says stop waiting for tomorrow and be prepared. Responding to Jesus isn't a passive action but calls us to active response in the here and now.

The Gospel reminds us to face each day with a determination to be a part of building a better world, part of the solution, part of peace in the way we act and prepare for the future.

Let us be one of his points of entry by keeping awake to open the door when he knocks.

What has Christ put me in charge of? How am I doing? Will I be delighted to see him when he comes?

# Dear Parishioners.

Today is the First Sunday in Advent, Year B in the Liturgical year. Today is also considered as **Migrants Day**, a Day to remember and pray for Migrants and refugees.

We enter a new Liturgical Cycle, the Year of Mark starting this Advent. Advent is a season for devout and joyful expectation. This season calls for a moderation in all our celebrations.

Friday 8th of December is the solemnity of the Feast of the Immaculate Conception.

**90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary**: Next Sunday we enter the 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebrations of St. Bernadette and Our Lady of Victories in Ensbury Park. 10<sup>th</sup> December Sunday falls the anniversary of the Canonization of St. Bernadette.

**POSADA**: Welcoming the statue of Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem is customarily followed in our parish. It starts in St. Bernadette this week. You are kindly requested to write your names to welcome the statue of Mary and Joseph as an immediate preparation for the Feast of Christmas in our Parish.

**Jubilee Year**: Our Church across the world is excitedly preparing for the 2025 year of Jubilee. It will be year of great celebrations! Pope Francis, has called for "An Year of Prayer" beginning this Advent, and all dioceses are being encouraged to take part. This will be a great opportunity for each of us to make a real effort to deepen our prayer lives and mature in our discipleship so that we can go forth and share the Good News just as Jesus commanded. To help and encourage locally, our department of Evangelisation has produced a series of Prayer Workshops. Workshop 1:

'Pray Without Ceasing' – An interactive prayer workshop commencing in Advent and for the Year of Prayer. 'Why should we pray?' 'Does God always answer our prayers?'

These two important questions are analysed and discussed along with tips to help us to pray. Contemplative prayer and imaginative contemplation are also explored with an opportunity to participate in an imaginative contemplation exercise with feedback and discussion.

Guided group work in helping people to pray with others.

Reflection: Jesus says on His second coming

"Be on watch, Be alert, for we do not know when the time will come". (Mk. 13:33)

Arthur Tonne recalls an interesting foot note of history that occurred in the fifth century. It concerns a group of monks popularly known as the 'Sleepless Ones'. A holy man, known simply as Alexander, recruited 300 monks and divided them into six groups. Each group took turns keeping "watch" for the Second Coming of Jesus, the Bridegroom and the Final judge.

The story of the "Sleepless Ones" invites me to ask, If Jesus came ten minutes from now, how ready would I be?


# **GIFT AID**
