

**First reading**      Jonah 3:1-5,10 ·

The word of the Lord was addressed to Jonah: 'Up!' he said 'Go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach to them as I told you to.' Jonah set out and went to Nineveh in obedience to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was a city great beyond compare: it took three days to cross it. Jonah went on into the city, making a day's journey. He preached in these words, 'Only forty days more and Nineveh is going to be destroyed.' And the people of Nineveh believed in God; they proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least. God saw their efforts to renounce their evil behaviour, and God relented: he did not inflict on them the disaster which he had threatened.

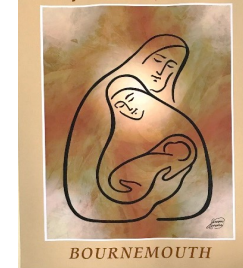

In the gospel this Sunday Jesus meets people while they doing their ordinary daily work of fishing and mending their nets on the sea

Jesus calls us wherever we are, regardless of who are. Each of is called by Jesus. He breaks into our world through our ordinary daily lives and activities. Jesus has not stopped calling people to follow him. Today we are the ones he looks at, calls by name and says, '*Come follow me.*'

Those in the gospel dropped everything they were doing and followed Jesus when he called them. This was all very sudden and dramatic. Our response may not be as quick and decisive. But it doesn't need to be.

We all follow Jesus at our own pace, in our time and in our own way.

The important thing to remember and realise is that Jesus never stops calling us by our name. He is still inviting us to follow him with these words, *if you want to be disciple, come, take up your cross and follow me*

Today is Third Sunday in Ordinary Time !!!

**A week of Christian Unity:** This week starting from last Thursday the Church celebrates the Christian Unity initiated 60 years ago after the historic encounter of Pope Paul VI and Ecumenical Patriarch Athenagoras. That memorable meeting led the way for the one that took place on December 7<sup>th</sup> 1965, when leaders of the two churches lifted their mutual excommunications of 1054. And it paved the path for “the symbol of division” to be substituted by “the symbol of charity”. With the repeal of excommunications, both Churches, the Church of Rome and the Church of Constantinople began to get recognized as sister churches and all the more significant that the patrons of both the Churches, Saints Peter and Andrew were biological brothers! May that spirit manifested 60years ago may continue to unite Catholics and Orthodox in their common faith and endeavour !

**90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of St. Bernadette:** Last Sunday the 11am Mass did bring us to a Pre Covid experience of our gathering at Holy Mass. It was a beautiful gathering and all co operated The meeting in Jerusalem in 1964 wholeheartedly. Thanks to all who made the day worth remembering. We still long for the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes which falls on February 11<sup>th</sup>. Let us join once again during this anniversary year to celebrate our faith living for 90 years!

**Jubilee Year:** Our Church across the world is excitedly preparing for the 2025 year of Jubilee. It will be year of great celebrations! Pope Francis, has called for “An Year of Prayer “and cherish a desire to proclaim the Good News. **Reflection:** Jesus said to Simon “Come with me and I will teach to catch men” At one they went with Him. (Mk.1:17-18)

John Henry Newman went to Rome to discern if Jesus was calling him to follow him as a Roman Catholic. One day on his return voyage he prayed, “Lead me, O Lord....I cannot see the way....Lead kindly light!” The words brought such peace to him that he took a pencil and began to write. When he finished, he had written the lyrics to the famous hymn “Lead Kindly Light”. Upon his return to England, he entered the Catholic Church, and became one of the greatest leaders. Can I recall a time when, like Newman, I placed all my trust in Jesus to lead me through a night of darkness?

*Lead kindly light....the night is dark, and I am far from home; Lead thou me on.....  
I do not ask to see the distant scene ... one step enough for me.... Cardinal Newman*
