The Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First reading Deuteronomy 18:15-20

Moses said to the people: 'The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like myself, from among yourselves, from your own brothers; to him you must listen. This is what you yourselves asked of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the Assembly. "Do not let me hear again" you said "the voice of the Lord my God, nor look any longer on this great fire, or I shall die"; and the Lord said to me, "All they have spoken is well said. I will raise up a prophet like yourself for them from their own brothers; I will put my words into his mouth and he shall tell them all I command him. The man who does not listen to my words that he speaks in my name, shall be held answerable to me for it. But the prophet who presumes to say in my name a thing I have not commanded him to say, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die."

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 94(95):1-2,6-9

R: O that today you would listen to his voice! 'Harden not your hearts.'

Come, ring out our joy to the Lord; hail the rock who saves us. Let us come before him, giving thanks, with songs let us hail the Lord. *R*:

Come in; let us bow and bend low; let us kneel before the God who made us: for he is our God and we the people who belong to his pasture, the flock that is led by his hand. *R*:

O that today you would listen to his voice! 'Harden not your hearts as at Meribah, as on that day at Massah in the desert when your fathers put me to the test; when they tried me, though they saw my work.' *R:*

Second reading 1 Corinthians 7:32-35 ·

I would like to see you free from all worry. An unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

Gospel Mark 1:21-28

Jesus and his disciples went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the sabbath came he went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.

In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.



The Gospel shows us that Jesus had power—those in the synagogue saw and experienced the power....
But what kind of power is it?

It is the power of authority. The word authority comes from a Latin verb augere, which means to make something increase.

So real authority is not just, as we often interpret it, having power over people so that we can make them do what we want them to do. Genuine authority is the ability to en-able people, to em-power them. To ena-



ble them to exceed themselves, to grow as persons, to be more effective of their innate gifts.



Authority is service—This is the kind of authority which Jesus wields. Jesus did not come to rule and control people. He came, he said, 'not to be served but to serve'. He came, above all, to make people free. So that in their freedom, they could be alive with the life of God within them. He freed them from all the 'evil spirits' of fear, compulsions, narrow self -centredness, anger, resentment, hostility and violence which prevent people from truly enjoying the experience of being alive. "I have come that they may have life, life in abundance."



How sad it is then that so many people see being faithful to the Christian faith as a burden to be discarded so that they can be "free" of oppression and limitation. That they do not see the relevance of faith and the authority of good over evil. Faith encourages us to seek spiritual healing and guidance in our lives, understanding that through faith, we can overcome challenges—this is the real freedom!

So, let us all pray today that Jesus, with his authority will be a real source of liberation for us. May he free us from all those spirits which make us deaf, dumb, blind and lame in life – and paralysed by fear.

Today is Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time! It is Racial Justice Day – Justice and Peace in the world. A day for an optional collection for CARJ (Catholic Association for Racial Justice) Racial Justice Sunday is intended to pray:

- For tolerance and respect, For an openness to neighbours and strangers.
- For the broadening of our horizons and an awareness of what is happening in our world.
- For individuals, groups or movements that promote war and conflicts.
- That Christ Prince of Peace might turn hearts to a culture of life.

Movable dates of the Feasts this Year:

14th February Ash Wednesday, beginning of Lent Season

31st of March.....Easter Sunday

9th May.....Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord

19th of May.....Feast of Pentecost...Our International Mass Day.

2nd of June.....Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ....

1st December......First Sunday of Advent., beginning of Advent Season.

Jubilee Year: Pope Francis, has called the Church across the world to be preparing for the 2025 as an year of Jubilee with the theme "Pilgrims of Hope". It will be year of great celebrations with an intense study of the Documents of Second Vatican Council and focus on Prayer for the proclamation of Good News . It will also remind and enable us to rediscover the wealth of riches that the Council gave to us, and in a spirit of prayerful generosity to reflect on the pilgrim journey which we are all on as the People of God. Reflection: A man with an evil spirit screamed...."What do you want with us Jesus? Jesus ordered the spirit "Be quiet and come out of the man". The evil spiritcame out of him. (Mk.1:23-26)

The movie "The Exorcist "is based on a true story of a boy from Mount Rainier, Maryland.. Newsweek magazine wrote of the boy "After he was admitted in Georgetown University Hospital, the boy began to mouth fierce curses in ancient languages and at one point, while strapped helplessly in his bed, long scratches appeared on his body". The boy survived and now lives near Washington DC. This true story recalls how Jesus expelled evil spirits - a sign that God's Kingdom was replacing Satan's kingdom. It also reminds us that we must finish what Jesus began. What is one way I am working to finish the war against evil, that Jesus began?
