16th Sunday of Ordinary Time

First reading Jeremiah 23:1-6

'Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered – it is the Lord who speaks! This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them.

Right, I will take care of you for your misdeeds – it is the Lord who speaks! But the remnant of my flock I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures: they shall be fruitful and increase in numbers. I will raise up shepherds to look after them and pasture them; no fear, no terror for them any more; not one shall be lost – it is the Lord who speaks!

'See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I will raise a virtuous Branch for David, who will reign as true king and be wise, practising honesty and integrity in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel dwell in confidence. And this is the name he will be called: The-Lord-our-integrity.'

In Christ Jesus, you that used to be so far apart from us have been brought very close, by the blood of Christ. This was to create one single New Man in himself out of the two of them and by restoring peace through the cross, to unite them both in a single Body and reconcile them with God: in his own person he killed the hostility. Later he came to bring the good news of peace, peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near at hand. Through him, both of us have in the one Spirit our way to come to the Father.

Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me All the days of my life.


And I shall dwell in the house of the Lord My whole life long.

Today is sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary time.

Today is our **PARISH FEAST DAY**! It's a time to join as ONE Parish. As you know the Feast of the Holy Family is in December. In order that we have a celebration at a time of year that is better suited we have it in the summer time. It is also so important that we have these joint services and that as many people from each church attend and it shows unity in a world where this is so lacking.

WORLD GRAND PARENTS DAY: Next Sunday 28th of July is celebrated as world Grand Parents Day. It was established by Pope Francis in 2021 and celebrated annually. And the Major penitentiary has declared a plenary indulgences on the grandparents, elderly and on all the faithful who "motivated by a true penance and charity" participate in today's liturgical celebrations all over the world.

Reflection: Being the feast of the Holy Family, it would be well enough to reflect on our Family life. We are in a period, witnessing a breakdown of the traditional family life and its values. – filial respect for authority, exercised responsibly by parents - and a rising juvenile delinquency. Hence our society can learn a few things from today's feast.

Of course, there is no easy remedy available for today's family crisis. Also the Christian family is part of a culture in which man participates – neighbourhood, school, television, friends and recreational patterns. But in stormy weather the ship may get at least some guidance from a beacon, and that is the example of the Holy Family before us today, where each one is entrusted with some responsibilities which is exercised in tune with the will of God. In fact the authority from earliest infancy on should be exercised – Mary politely questions Jesus when He was found in the Temple away from the parents – perhaps in a different way, it should not be done away with. Parents could discuss this with their children. A substitute for sound family life has not been offered by any other behavioural sciences, We should distinguish between the core of the Christian ethic and the cloth in which it is wrapped. This cloth is conditioned by time and culture and not necessarily part of the divine message. But the message on family life as such is timeless.
