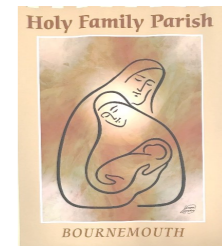

NEW LECTIONARY from DEC. 1st.



For the past few decades we have been using the Jerusalem Bible translation of the scriptures at Mass. From the 1st Sunday of Advent we will be using the English Standard Version (Catholic Edition). Of course, you can continue to use your existing familiar missals and mass books; the scripture readings remain the same. The only difference is that when you hear the readings being proclaimed at Mass, they will be in a slightly different translation. The readings will continue to be printed in the weekly newsletter, but using the new translation. Please note that Readers at Mass will need to have an advance copy of the readings they will proclaim, in order to prepare in advance because the new text will be unfamiliar. Readers will therefore need a copy of a new Missal or Parish Mass Book, with the new translation. This is currently being organised by the Parish or they can be obtained online at www.mccrimmons.com. To provide some very useful and interesting information about the new translation, the bishops of Great Britain are recommending 3 YouTube video presentations:
